1 T. vanilla 2 cups flour

CHIPPY SQUARES

Melt ¼ lb. butter or margarine in an oblong pyrex dish. Over that, pour 1 cup graham cracker crumbs. Then scatter one can coconut, one package chocolate chips, one package butterscotch chips, one package nuts (any kind) and one can of Eagle Brand milk over ail. Bake at 325 degrees for 30 minutes or until light brown on top.


